AVI IS OPEN FOR BUSINESS!

The Avi Resort and Casino is committed to the health and well-being of our guests and team members. Their safety and well-being is our highest priority. As such, we are closely monitoring the evolving COVID-19 (coronavirus) situation and are in constant contact with the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), the Southern Nevada Health District (SNHD), and the Nevada Gaming Control Board (NGCB) regarding the same. Based upon the recommendations of those agencies, we have enhanced our already robust cleaning and health and safety standards by implementing the following new policies and procedures.

Pursuant to Governor Sisolak's direction on Sunday, March 15, 2020, the Nevada Gaming Control Board is enforcing the following restrictions on licensees who choose to continue operations at this time:

- 1. There may be no more than three chairs at each table game.
- 2. Each gaming machine must be cleaned and sanitized at least once every two hours.
- 3. Patrons may not serve themselves from buffets that remain open. Similarly, employees may not serve themselves in employee dining areas.
- 4. The gaming floor and other public areas of a licensee's property must operate under the latest social distancing guidance from Nevada's medical advisory team.

As a result of the Governor's directions, the Avi is making the following changes:

- 1. The Buffet and Bingo operations have been temporarily suspended.
- 2. To comply with the latest Social Distancing guidelines noted above, every other slot machine will be placed out of service. For the past three weeks, the property has been cleaning and sanitizing all slot machines at least every two hours.
- 3. Each Table Game will only have three chairs.

Additional Safety Measures:

- 1. Public touch points, such as door handles, elevator buttons, handrails, restrooms and ATM machines, are cleaned multiple times throughout the day.
- 2. Slot machines are wiped and surfaces cleaned multiple times throughout the day and cards or dice on table games are changed or replaced with regularity.
- 3. Additional hand sanitizer stations have been strategically placed throughout the property's public areas.
- 4. Amplified air circulation is being provided throughout the property.
- 5. Protocols have been implemented in other departments to ensure guests' health and safety.

For Our Team Members:

- 1. Team Members from departments temporarily closed will be utilized in another department to fulfill our guest's needs.
- 2. Team members are instructed each day on the correct methods to properly sanitize their hands.
- 3. Team members are also instructed to wash their hands before and after eating and before returning to a work area, including after every break.
- 4. Additional hand sanitizer stations have been strategically placed throughout each property's back-ofhouse areas. Proper cleanliness and health procedures are also posted in those areas.
- 5. Enhanced training is being provided regarding all food safety standards.

All team members are prohibited from coming to work if sick or demonstrating health symptoms that could impact fellow team members or guests. The following amendment was approved by Avi Casino Enterprise Board of Directors on Monday, March 16, 2020.

Amendment to policy effective 03.16.2020: Should a team member be diagnosed by a licensed medical provider as having the flu or contagious disease or virus, evidenced by producing a note from the medical provider confirming the diagnosis, the team member is requested to not come to work. Under this circumstance, the team member will be considered excused and no point(s) will be given.

As always, we want you to enjoy your experience with us. We will continue to work closely with the SNHD, CDC and NGCB to keep guests and team members safe. The Avi will follow additional mandates from those agencies as directed.
